Proposed upgrade for Western Coal Services

Centennial has recently submitted a briefing paper to the Department of Planning and Infrastructure (DP&I) proposing an upgrade to its’ existing infrastructure at its Western Coal Services site near Blackmans Flat.

This site manages and processes coal to improve its quality prior to rail dispatch, via Centennial’s Lidsdale Siding, for export to overseas markets.

The proposed upgrade will increase the total coal handling capacity of the site to up to 9.5 million tonnes per year and will facilitate the sourcing of coal from other Centennial operations.

“This proposed upgrade will provide Centennial with the market flexibility, new opportunities for future Centennial projects in the local area, will providing

security to Centennial’s existing operations”, said Mick Cairney, General Manager Western Operations.

will require approval from the DP&I who will use the information provided in the briefing paper to determine what issues need to be addressed in the Environmental Impact Statement that Centennial will prepare in support of the upgrade works.
