## Development Consent for Airly

While Airly mine may be on 'Care and Maintenance', a project team has remained on site to work towards securing Airly's Development Consent which will enable Airly, when market conditions improve, to play a role in Centennial's future operations.

Airly's project team is working to not only secure Airly's operational future but also to continue to meet safety and environmental regulations and maintain the current surface infrastructure.

"We are working to ensure Airly secures its Development Consent prior to October 2014, when the current consent is due for renewal, so Airly will be in a position to re-open sometime in the future if market conditions improve," said Centennial's Pieter Van Rooyen.

If granted, the Development Consent will allow Airly to operate within its approved mining lease as well as allow an extension of mining into the areas that are

currently licenced for exploration.

The project also focuses on evaluating various mining methods to improve the operational performance of the mine while minimising any potential environmental impacts associated with underground mining activities.

## Inglenook Project update

2013 will see the Inglenook Project continue with its exploration drilling program in addition to the work required for a future Environmental Impact Statement (EIS).

"We anticipate the drilling program for Inglenook will continue throughout the first part of this year continuing to capture more information around surface and groundwater quality, the quality and quantity of the coal resource and the different strata levels,"

"We will also start compiling baseline environmental data," said Centennial's Greg Banning.

The collection of baseline data, which is required for each season, will take several years and will include water quality and water flows, vegetation mapping, seasonal flora and fauna surveys, meteorological data, air quality and noise monitoring.
